- Staying informed about my child's education and communicating with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district either received by my child or by mail and responding, as appropriate.
- Serving, to the extent possible, on policy, on policy advisory groups, such as being the Title I, Part A parent representative on the school's School Improvement Team, the Title I Policy Advisory Committee, the District- wide Policy Advisory Council, the State's Committee of Practitioners, the School Support Team or other school advisory and/or policy groups.
- Attending the Monthly Parent Roundtables to find out the latest instructional priorities of Spruance School.

## **STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES:**

We, as students, will share the responsibility to improve our academic achievement and achieve the State's high standards. Specifically, we will:

- Do my homework every day and ask for help when I need it.
- Read at least 20 minutes every day outside of school time!
- Learn at least 1 new Vocabulary Word each day!
- Give to my parents or the adult who is responsible for my welfare all notices and information received by me from my school every day.
- Improve our PSSA Score by 10% or more in all tested

## **COMMUNICATION ABOUT STUDENT LEARNING:**

Gilbert Spruance Elementary School is committed to frequent two-way communication with families about children's learning. Some of the ways you can expect us to reach you are:

- Involve parents in the planning, review, and improvement of the school's parental involvement policy, in an organized, ongoing, and timely way.
- Involve parents in the joint development of any school-wide program plan, in an organized, ongoing, and timely way.
