

Gilbert Spruance School Parent and Family Engagement Policy

In support of strengthening student academic achievement, <u>Gilbert Spruance Elementary</u> receives Title I, Part A funds and therefore must jointly develop with, agree on with, and distribute to parents and family members of participating children a written parent and family engagement policy that contains information required by section 1116(b) and (c) of the "Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)". Section A: JOINTLY DEVELOPED

<u>Gilbert Spruance Elementary</u> will take the following actions to involve parents in an organized, ongoing, and timely manner in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I programs, including opportunities for regular meetings, if requested by parents, to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their child and respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible.

- Spruance School schedules monthly School Advisory Council meetings, Parent Roundtable Meetings that allows Parents to participate in the decisions related to the education of their child.
- Spruance School Teachers and staff members will be available for scheduled parent/teacher meetings and parent/teacher conferences in efforts receive and respond to any suggestions and thoughts concerning the education of students.

Section B: ANNUAL TITLE I MEETING

<u>Gilbert Spruance Elementary</u> will take the following actions to conduct an annual meeting, at a convenient time, and encourage and invite all parents of participating children to attend to inform them about the school's Title I program, the nature of the Title I program, the parents' requirements, the school parent and family engagement policy, the schoolwide plan, and the school-parent compact.

• Spruance School schedules a Title I meeting each spring to review the instructional plan for the coming School Year. The plan is again reviewed in the fall. Members of the school community including teachers, administrators, our community liaison, parents and the Home & School Association developed the School Improvement plan. The Community Liaison will serve as the link between the school and parents to disseminate information to parents and the community in an effort to solicit buy-in and community input. This collaborative team will also draft the School Compact that outlines how parents, staff and students will work together and share the responsibility of improving student achievement for every student, "Every Student, Every Day in Every Class."

- Interpreting Scores from the PSSA and other assessments

- Technology-Assisted Resources and Programs
- Parents and Teachers working together to achieve success for students
